THERE has been an enormous demand for Luther Literature during the last week, and the Religious Tract Society's sheet of events in the great monk's career seems to have won universal favour. The first issue of 10,000 was taken up in a day, and the demand for it since by the heads of Sunday and day schools has been at the rate of not less than 12,000 a day. The cheap and popular edition of 'The Life of Luther,' issued in October last, has been received with such general favour that the eightieth thousand is now in course of printing. Last week nearly 1,000 copies of Dr. Macaulay's 'Luther Anecdotes' went out of the depository in a day, and two very large editions of the work have already been sold. Dr. Macaulay's 'Selections from Luther's Table Talk ' has also had a very extensive sale ; and a large edition of the Rev. Dr. Stoughton's 'Homes and Haunts of Luther,' published in October, is nearly exhausted. In the Exhibition of Luther Relics, held at Exeter Hall, in connection with the Fourth Centenary of his birth, there are many literary curiosities, including five ancient German Bibles according to Luther's version which are not to be found in the British Museum Library. Viewed from our standpoint, Luther was at least a benefactor not only of his own country, but of Europe, for, to use the words of an able article in Monday's Times, borrowed, if we mistake not, from Dr. von Döllinger, he 'was the true founder of articulate German Literature.' This is high praise, but we believe it to be well deserved. Nothing was said in the article in question on Luther's work as a hymn-writer, and yet in this particular he has never been excelled and only equalled by our own Charles Wesley. It will be a satisfactory outcome of the present celebration if the complete edition of his works, a first instalment of which has already been issued in Berlin, is carried to a successful close. In England Professors Wace and Buchheim are preparing a translation, already announced for immediate publication, of the famous ninety-five Theses, the Appeal to the German Emperor and Nobility, and the treatises on Christian Liberty and the Babylonish Captivity of the Church.

We have glanced at a 'subscription copy' of the book, which will be ready for the trade by the time these lines are printed, and we have been much struck by the success with which Mr. Pyle has thrown himself back into the artistic style of book illustration of bygone days. The pictures are so thoroughly antique that a superficial observer might fancy they were printed from ancient plates, but this is of course the aim of the designer, who is to be congratulated on the success with which he gives us sketches of the hero and of his 'merry men.' Mr. Pyle tells the story in capital English, to which, moreover, he contrives to jimpart the same antique flavour already noted in the pictures, and the headlines and ornaments are all in perfect keeping. The binding, too, deserves a word of praise ; in fact, as we have implied, the book is unique.

Messrs. John F. Shaw & Co.—whose goodly show of story books, not only for children but for young men and maidens, is always one of the pleasant prospects of Christmas timeare about to issue with the commencement of 1884 a new sixpenny 'Home Series,' which is likely to attain considerable popularity, especially in rural districts where a really good 'sixpenny book' is 'a find' to the retail trade. From the specimen we have seen, with what young folks will unanimously vote to be the attractive title of 'Froggy,' we prophesy success for the series.

The Companion to the British Almanack, published by the Company of Stationers, will give in its issue for 1884 many important articles on topics of current interest, thus strengthening its claim to be regarded as 'a Year Book ' in the .rue sense of the words. Mr. John Dennis, whose 'Heroes of English Literature ' has just met with a favourable reception from the critics, writes on 'The Channel Tunnel,' an article which supplies, we hear, a complete

Messrs. Longmans have just ready an important library edition of the late Sir William Stirling Maxwell's 'Don John of Austria; or, Passages from the History of the Sixteenth Century, 1547-78.' The original book, a twenty-five guinea folio, of which only 115 copies were issued, is now out of print; but this edition, reduced from the larger work, presents all its most noteworthy features, including the numerous illustrations engraved on wood, consisting of portraits, shipping, armour, weapons, costumes, &c., from authentic sources. The same publisher's translation of Koestlin's 'Life of Luther' has been generally referred to as the most important contribution made to the literature of the Luther Festival. Messrs. Longman have now ready Dr. Edersheim's Warburtonian Lectures on 'The Life and Times of Jesus the Messiah,' a very important contribution to this special department of theological books. Among other recent issues from the firm of a lighter type is a volume in which Mr. Richard Jefferies tells 'The Story of my Heart.'

Messrs. Sampson Low & Co. are, we venture to predict, likely to find that their dainty and quaintly illustrated volume, 'The Merry Adventures of Robin Hood, of Great Renown in Nottinghamshire,' of which Mr. Howard Pyle is both author and artist, will be one of the

sketch of the origin of the scheme and of the opinions for and against it. Mr. W. E. A. Axon, of statistical fame at Manchester and elsewhere, deals with 'The Migration of Birds' and 'Longevity.' Mr. Manley, whose Handbook has just been issued by the authorities of the Fisheries Exhibition, contributes a descriptive and critical account of the latest South Kensington show, and an article on 'Thrift.' Messrs. J. F. Iselin, M.A., and W. A. Buckmaster, M.A., of the South Kensington Science and Art Department, chronicle 'the Science of the Year.' Mr. W. Davenport Adams, author of the 'Dictionary of English Literature,' writes a review of the meetings of the scientific associations held during the vear at the great provincial centres. Mr. C. S. Murray contributes an exhaustive account of Kew Observatory and its wonderful instruments, of which even scientific men know but little, and the general public still less. Mr. Charles Mackeson tells the story of the Handel Festival from the day when the composer of the Messiah superintended the performance of his own oratorios down to the meeting of the past year at Sydenham, and writes a paper on 'The Dwellings of the Poor,' based upon the report of the recent House of Commons Committee on the subject. Mr. Evelyn Freeth, of the Inland Revenue Department, writes on 'The Importation of Food.' In addition to these special articles there are the usual reviews of the architecture of the year; the music of the year; the picture exhibitions of the year; and English philanthropy. The abstracts of the Acts of the session, which form a timehonoured and useful feature in the work, include, we understand, full digests of the Bankruptcy Act and of the Agricultural Holdings Act. In the Clergyman's Almanac will appear a complete table of the confirmations of the year 1882, showing the number of confirmations held in each English, Welsh, and Irish Diocese, and the number of males and females confirmed. This table and a table of ordinations have, we are informed, been specially compiled for the book from returns personally furnished by the bishops. The almanac also gives a list of the representatives of the various dioceses at the Central Council of Diocesan Conferences.

The strain on the resources of the Publication Department of the Religious Tract Society, caused by the run upon its Luther literature, has not prevented Dr. Macaulay from perfecting his arrangements for the new year's issues of the Leisure Hour and Sunday at Home, and for the readers of each he has an attractive programme. In the Leisure Hour, Prebendary Harry Jones, who has added to his knowledge of the London poor, acquired in Soho and St. George'sin-the-East, a rural experience in his present Suffolk Rectory, is to write on 'The Housing of the Poor'; Mr. Cordy Jeaffreson, famous for novels and commonplace books as well as for his more severe work on historical records, promises papers on 'Doctors out of Practice'; Principal Dawson, of McGill College, Montreal, will give some 'Rough Notes, Geological and Anthropological, on Egypt and Syria,' the materials for which he will shortly be collecting in those countries, whither he is journeying to examine the interesting Pre-Adamic remains; Mrs. Josephine Butler is to send some sketches of 'French Heroines'; sterner stuff is to come from Professor Leone Levi, of statistical reputation, in papers on 'The British People: their Income and Expenditure, their Virtues and their Vices'; and Mr. Whitaker is to tell again the tales of 'Some Famous Booksellers,' to which he will doubtless be able to add some personal touches from his experiences in 'the Row' and out of it. This, it will be admitted, proves that the editor has been foraging with good success. In the Sunday at Home the Rev. H. C. Adams is to treat of 'Religious Manias,' including 'The Witch Mania,' 'The Crusade Mania,' 'The Millennarian Mania,' 'The Jew Mania,' 'The Flagellants,' 'The Dancing Mania'; Canon Tristram is to recount his adventures on the banks of the Tigris and Euphrates; Mr. I. R. Vernon, author of 'The Harvest of a Quiet Eye,' of whom we have heard too little of late, promises some 'Thoughts and By-Thoughts'; Mr. Paxton Hood, the versatile preacher, lecturer, and author, is to talk about 'Great and Good Books'; and then a lighter vein is to be reached by the author of 'Christie Redfern's Troubles,'Agnes Giberne, and Mrs. Barr, in a group of serial tales. The January parts which will commence these promising volumes are to be ready before Christmas.

Several of the Government Departments are this year unusually late in issuing their Bluebooks, and among others the Report of the Commissioners of Customs, which usually contains so much interesting information as to the trade of the country, is still answered 'not out' at Messrs. Hansard's depôt. The delay in the publication of these works deprives them to a very large extent of their interest and value. A second edition of the Report of the Royal Commission on Ecclesiastical Courts is, we hear, in preparation, the first issue having been completely sold out.

We are enabled to state that there is no truth in the assertion of the Pall Mall Gazette that the Right Hon. H. C. Raikes, M.P., is about to establish a new weekly Conservative newspaper. Mr. Raikes is a director of the Banner Newspaper Company, and has been from the first a warm supporter of that journal, his connection with which probably suggested the paragraph published by our contemporary. The London correspondent of the Continental Gazette says that the People, a weekly journal of which Dr. Evans, formerly of Birmingham, is the editor, has met with but scanty support, and that there is a rumour that its issue will

be discontinued. The plan of publishing articles on important social questions from the pen of the leading Conservative statesmen of the day, signed by the authors, seems to be winning a very wide circulation for the National Review, the October number of which has already gone to a third edition. Viscount Cranbrook is to contribute to the November number.

The monument to Pepys in the Church of St. Olave, Hart Street, Mark Lane, in the city of London, the erection of which was resolved upon at a meeting held in the church vestry on July 5, 1882, is, we hear, now completed. It is similar in design to that erected in St. Dunstan's Church to the memory of the Rev. Thomas White, founder of Sion College, and has been designed by Mr. Blomfield. At a meeting of the committee, on Monday last, it was decided to make arrangements for the unveiling of the monument in the course of the next few weeks, and the ceremony is likely to excite considerable interest in literary circles. The Rev. the Hon. L. Neville, Master of Magdalene College, Cambridge (where Pepys was a student), has acted as chairman of the committee, and the memorial has been subscribed for by admirers of the works of the former Secretary of the Admiralty on both sides of the Atlantic.

Mr. James Hilton is engaged on a second volume of Chronograms, which is to be published by Mr. Elliot Stock.

Professor Sidgwick, who has been elected to the Knightbridge Chair of Moral Philosophy at Cambridge, in succession to Mr. Birks, is, we believe, the only professor at the University who is a Doctor of Literature.

A series of papers on the 'History and Antiquities of the House of Lords,' by Mr. J. Gairdner, Mr. J. R. Round, Miss Toulmin Smith, and Mr. J. S. Udal, will appear in the *Antiquary* for next year.

[•]Lodge's Peerage and Baronetage for 1884' will shortly be published by Messrs. Hurst & Blackett. The same firm have in the press two new novels—'Di Fawcett,' by C. L. Pirkis, and 'One False, Both Fair,' by John Berwick Harwood, each in 3 vols.

Messrs. Griffith & Farran will publish immediately an edition of 'Cape Cod Folks,' a work which is in its twenty-second thousand in America. It created considerable excitement on its first appearance there, and, though its personal interest will not be so strong for English readers, its faithful character, portraiture, and the fulness of the subject will no doubt ensure for it a pleasant welcome from the reading public of England.

The same publishers will on the 20th inst. commence the publication of a series of Sermons for the Christian Year, which will be issued monthly, edited by the Rev. W. Benham, rector of St. Edmund the King and Martyr, Lombard Street, and one of the six preachers in Canterbury Cathedral. The sermons are selected from the works of modern divines, each one having a special reference to the season for which it is intended.

'Heath's Fern Portfolio' is the general title of a series of life-size reproductions of ferns. in which the author of 'The Fern World' will give, what has never before been attempted. namely, absolute facsimiles in form, colour, and venation of these beautiful plants, together with letterpress descriptions on the same plates. Mr. Heath's new serial will be published monthly by Messrs. Sampson Low, Marston, & Co.

'Town Life in Australia' is the title of a new volume of essays on Australian manners

and customs of the present day, to be published by Mr. Elliot Stock.

Messrs. George Bell & Sons have just issued a second edition of 'Mackeson's Mission Room Addresses.'

'The History of the Development of the House' is the subject of a series of articles which will appear in the Antiquary for 1884, from the pen of Mr. H. B. Wheatley.

'Don't, a manual of mistakes in conduct and speech,' which has had quite a successful run in America, will be issued immediately by Messrs. Griffith & Farran, in a revised edition for English readers.

Harper's Weekly has a note on Mr. Trollope and his publishers, and says: 'Mr. Trollope, in arguing the international copyright question, says that he is not aware that he ever received a shilling for American reprints of his works, but that he sold all foreign rights to his publishers, who received very trifling sums from America. Of course, therefore, Mr. Trollope had no direct personal knowledge of the facts. If, however, he received nothing, it was not because nothing was paid. Inquiry upon the subject would have apprised him that the amount of such payment was large, and that as much as £750 was paid for a single one of his works, although there could be no other protection than priority of publication.'

A meeting of students was held at St. Andrews, Edinburgh, on the 5th inst., to promote the candidature of Mr. James Russell Lowell for the Lord Rectorship. Mr. Lowell is brought forward on purely non-political grounds, his claims to the honour being based on his reputation as a poet and literary critic.

Captain Reid's latest literary scheme, as detailed in a recent letter to the editor of the New York Tribune, was to write his personal reminiscences of the Mexican war, out of which he thought to make a stout octavo volume. His plan was to give the picturesque episodes of the war, avoiding purely historical details. 'I trust to make the work instructive,' he said, 'and hope also to produce a more interesting book than any of my poor romances.'

The Publishers' Circular

The Town Gardener, a new weekly, appears under the editorship of Mr. Tom Jerrold, who for a long time past has furnished the gardening article to the Weckly Dispatch. He is the youngest son of Douglas Jerrold.

Mr. H. Buxton Forman is about to add to the book world what should be a most interesting history of a man of whom not much is known, but in whom a great deal of interest is taken—the poet John Keats. The work will be issued during the season through Messrs. Reeves & Turner, and will be comprised in four octavo volumes. Sir Charles Dilke, who possesses several of Keats's most important works, together with a large number of friends and relations of the poet, have placed their collections at Mr. Forman's disposal, and these, together with his posthumous poems, have been collated as far as possible with the author's manuscript. There are no less than five authentic portraits of Keats amongst the illustrations, and for the first time will be published in these volumes a large number of letters to various persons, together with some of those revised which have already appeared at different times.

^{*} A Philadelphia firm have prepared an edition of Lord Byron's works, to be known as the Newstead edition, containing six portraits of Byron and copies from miniatures of many of his friends. The sketch of the poet's life has been prepared by Professor John Nichol and Mr. John Cordy Jeaffreson.

Mr. Austin Dobson, it is said, has undertaken to edit (in addition to 'The Vicar of Wakefield' in the 'Parchment Library') a selection from the writings of Sir Kichard Steele for the Clarendon Press, and also a selection from Horace Walpole's letters for the 'Golden Treasury' series.

The Christmas number of the Christian Million which is to be issued November 26, will contain, besides smaller contributions, two complete stories entitled 'It Only Wants Turning Round,' by P. B. Power, M.A., and 'My Adventure in Dreamland,' by C. Despard. The number will be accompanied by a beautiful presentation plate, printed in fourteen colours, entitled 'Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star,' from an original painting by A. F. Patten.

Messrs. William Clowes & Sons, Limited, 13 Charing Cross, announce a new Christmas gift book, entitled 'Pompeii, Past and Present.' The volume will be illustrated with thirty-nine photographs, taken expressly for the work by Messrs. Lauro, of Naples.

Cassell's Sunday Journal is, of course, essentially a periodical for the people. But a glance at the varied contents of the first part, which is before us, shows that the tastes of the public which reads the more expensive magazines have also been consulted. The series of pieces entitled 'After-dinner anecdotes,' some of the poetical pieces, a 'trait of Balzac,' by that most Parisian of writers, M. Houssaye, and 'Girl Life in Germany,' are evidences of the skill of the editor.

Messrs. Barnicott & Son have once more issued from the Athenæum Book Store, Taunton, their useful catalogue of current English books. It extends to 108 pages, small octavo. It is arranged in eight classes, besides a department at the beginning, which enumerates the newest publications, and there is a double-column index which occupies no less than a sixth of the catalogue.

Messrs. Marion & Co.'s latest novelty is a series of yachting pieces in instantaneous photography. There are two sets, each consisting of twelve pictures. One of them is 12 by 10 mches, the other 10 by 8 inches. These portraits which are of well-known racing yachts have been photographed from the deck of another yacht, at sea. As delineations of craft, some of them in rapid motion through the water, as shown by the waves which break about them, these photographs are very striking. The play of light and shade about the sails, the various aspects of racing under canvas, of yachts becalmed, and of their reflection in the still water, are conveyed in a manner which, we believe, has not hitherto been attempted. Another new publication of Messrs. Marion & Co. is six instantaneous photographs of the regatta at Henley, which give us, in turn, the crowd, the start, the race, the finish, and other incidents of a fashionable boat race. Messrs. Letts have produced, as the presentation plate of Yule-Tide, the Christmas number of their Illustrated Household Magazine, a beautifully executed plate, 'The Little Foster Mother,' which, alike in design and colouring, it would be difficult to excel. Christmas in France, Christmas in Italy, Christmas in Germany, Christmas at sea, and Christmas in Australia, form the subject of effective full-page plates, and then for the children there are full-page plates, illustrating the most favourite nursery rhymes and tales. It is one of the most artistic Christmas numbers ever produced, and has the merit of being 'out in good time.' We are so accustomed to luxury in connection with Harper's Magazine that 'it goes without saying' that his Christmas number will be marked by special efforts to please the public taste. Among its special attractions are to be Mrs. Thackeray-Ritchie's ' Personal Sketch of Tennyson;' a humorous dramatic sketch by W. D. Howells; a gossip about the West Highlanders by William Black; a new poem by John G. Whittier; an opening paper, entitled 'Christmas,' by G. W. Curtis ; and thirteen illustrations by Abbey of Pope's 'Ode on Solitude.' Four of the illustrations will be full-page plates.

OBITUARY.

Mr. Henry Hart, a veteran in printing and as bookseller and stationer, died at Saffron Walden, October 28, aged 83. Apprenticed in 1813 to Mr. George Youngman, he stayed in the same employ until 1836, in which year he established a business in King Street, carried on for 40 years in same premises, altered many times. The business has been for some years carried on by his only son, William Hart, in the name of Hart & Son, and in 1876 was moved to more convenient premises, opposite to the old shop. Mr. Hart was much respected, which was shown by many of his fellow-townsmen following, and the closing of shops en route to the cemetery. He was for twenty-eight years Chairman of the Saffron Walden Building Society.

From Mr. G. Allen, Orpington.—'The Story of Ida.' This little book, the title of which is an epitaph on an Etrurian tomb, is edited, with a preface, by Professor Ruskin. He says:---

For some ten or twelve years I have been asking every good writer whom I knew to write some part of what was exactly true, in the greatest of sciences, that of Humanity. . The following story of a young Florentine girl's too short life is absolutely and simply true: it was written only for memorial of her among her friends, by the one of them that loved her best, and who knew her perfectly.

We will quote the concluding words of Professor Ruskin's preface :---

This is the story of a Catholic girl written by a Protestant one, yet the two of them so united in the Truth of the Christian Faith, and in the joy of its love, that they are absolutely unconscious of any difference in the forms or letter of their religion.

From Mr. W. H. Allen.—'A Scratch-team of Essays.' Under this title, Mr. Sept. Berdmore ('Nimshivich') reproduces in a volume certain papers which have already appeared in another form. 'The Kitchen and the Cellar' is reprinted from the 'Quarterly Review;' 'Thackeray,' from the 'Westminster;' 'Russia,' from the 'Westminster;' 'Carriages, Roads, and Coaches,' from the 'Quarterly.' More than sixteen years have elapsed since two of these essays appeared, which, of course, adds to their value in a collected form. The article entitled 'The Kitchen and the Cellar' is enriched by nearly fifty pages of closely printed illustrative matter now added, consisting of leading articles and letters from the 'Daily News' and 'Standard,' &c., 1877-1880. The author has also made some notes, which now appear for the first time.

Family Doctor's articles; the papers on 'Remunerative Employment for Gentlewomen;' the marvellous collection of useful and entertaining notes of 'The Gatherer;' the 'Family Parliament,' in which all sides of a question are discussed; and the music pages, presenting original songs with pianoforte accompaniment, are among the features which have won a high place for this work, notwithstanding the increasing number of its competitors. It is, moreover, well illustrated, and the volume for the year looks bright and cheery in its crimson and gold case.

From the same. — The Magazine of Art for November contains a very charming frontispiece, drawn and etched by Robert W. Macbeth, A.R.A., entitled 'Lady Bountiful.' Mr. Austin Dobson has written a poetical description of the picture in his usual very graceful style. Other very attractive features in this number are illustrated articles on Madrazo, the Spanish Painter, Venetian Glass, the Constantine Ionides Collection, &c., and a very timely article describing some celebrated Luther Portraits, and giving copies of them. Altogether the present number will add to the reputation of this most excellent magazine.

From the same.—The first part of the new volume of the Quiver for 1884 is that for the present month, November, and if the old proverb, 'well begun is half done,' were quite true, then the new Quiver volume would be already half done, for it is, undoubtedly, well begun. We have noticed that the Quiver never commits the fault of giving 'too much of a good thing.' Stories and articles in two chapters, or in two papers, or two parts, are interspersed with short complete articles. In the November Quiver there are no less than five-and-twenty arrows in the shape of articles, illustrated and otherwise, and those who have prepared these shafts are no unskilled hands. Whatever is written by such preachers as Burton Wollaston, J. W. Gedge, W. Boyd Carpenter, Gordon Calthrop, P. B. Power, Professor Blaikie, and J. H. Davies, is certain to find an almost endless circle of readers. The illustrations are very good, especially the frontispiece, which represents an audience at Westminster Abbey in the height of the season, listening to a preacher who has surprised them by the depth of his earnestness.

From Messrs. Blackie & Son.- 'Jeanne d'Arc, the Patriot Martyr, and other Narratives of Female Heroism in Peace and War.' The volume opens with a sketch of Joan of Arc; and next we have the story of the Countess of Nithsdale, whose husband had joined the Scottish Rebellion of 1715, and was condemned to death as a traitor. Having been placed in the Tower, his wife cleverly effected his rescue by dressing him as a woman. Flora Macdonald, the deliverer of Prince Charlie' Helen Walker, the original of Sir Walter Scott's 'Jeanie Deans'; Grace Darling and two American heroines, Deborah Sampson, whom the author puts forward as a sort of parallel to Joan of Arc, and whose feats of valour were performed in the war of 1876, and Agustina, the Maid of Saragossa, are the subjects of the remaining chapters. The illustrations are coloured, but are not of a very high order of art.

From Messrs. Cassell & Co. (Limited).—'Cassell's Family Magazine,' Volume for 1883. No magazine contrives to give a greater abundance of short and telling papers than is to be found in the pages of this well-known monthly. Fiction, tasay, and practical papers are happily combined, and the editor never forgets his title. The

From the same.—In Cassell's Family Magazine for November the pleasant serial story 'Pardoned,' by that very graceful writer the authoress of 'In a Minor Key,' is concluded in a very satisfactory manner. 'Salt Making in South Durham' gives an illustrated description of an industry we are all interested in but none of us know much about. An 'Analyst' fairly makes one's hair stand on end with his grim list of 'poisons in the house.' Who would have imagined the innocent 'stovepipe' or 'chimney-pot' hat could be guilty of blood poisoning? but this 'analyst' gives an instance of a gentleman who was troubled with a

severe eruption on the forehead and nearly lost an eye, when his doctor discovered he was in the habit of wearing a hat with a maroon lining in which a considerable quantity of arsenic was found. There is not the slightest doubt that the practice of using arsenic in lamp shades, wall papers of all colours, and in various highlycoloured articles of dress is responsible for much avoidable illness and inconvenience. They do these things better in Sweden, for there they heavily fine anyone selling goods which contain things of a poisonous nature. Cassell's Family Magazine would have had to fear as a dangerous rival the Saturday Journal if the latter paper had not been published by the same firm and had been put forward and produced with the same spirit and 'go.' At one leap the new journal has got ahead of all the many 'bits' and 'things' and 'scraps' which are threatening to sweep the older periodical literature away, and already monopolise all the posters on the bookstalls. One lesson to be learned from this inroad of light literature is no new one, but one too often forgotten, viz., that the public like to be amused.

- From Messrs. Field & Tuer.- 'Christmas Enter-This interesting and entertaining tainments." reprint—one of the printers' 'Vellum Parchment series of Miscellaneous Literature'---is a veritable cast from the antique, the original work having appeared in the year 1740. Its full title gives a complete description of its contents, and runs as follows :--- 'Christmas Entertainments : wherein is described abundance of Fiddle-Faddle Stuff, Rawheads, Bloody-Bones, Buggy-Bows, and such like horrible bodies, Eating. Drinking, Kissing, and other Diversions, Witches, Wizards, Conjurers, and their merry pranks, Fairies, Spectres, Ghosts, and Apparitions, a Right Merrie Tale, The Story of Jack Spriggins and the Enchanted Bean, curious memoirs of Old Father Christmas. Illustrated with many diverting cuts.' It is a quaint little book as regards its contents, and is a charming bit of typography.
- From Messrs. Isbister & Co.—'Good Words for 1883,' edited by Donald Macleod, D.D., and

Hopkins on 'Soldiers and Sailors at Home;' and then we have Dr. Richardson on 'Tricycles;' Mr. Henry Irving on 'Shakspeare on the Stage and in the Study;' Mr. Jefferies on 'The Green Corn;' and a budget of other pleasant pages of prose and verse, the writers of the latter including the Marquis of Lorne, Miss Doudney, the Bishop of Bedford, the Dean of Chester, the author of 'John Halifax,' and others equally well known. This is enough to show what an attractive and well-filled volume the publishers have produced.

- From the same .-- ' The Sunday Magazine,' Volume for 1883. Edited by the Rev. Benjamin Waugh. The chief serial tale in this volume is 'How it all came round,' by L. T. Meade; among the minor pieces of fiction being Mr. Edward Garrett's 'Lord of Himself,' and Julie Sutter's 'When the Sea gives up its Dead.' Biographical papers, papers on nature, travel papers, and philanthropical and missionary papers, with a budget of pretty poems, and the attractive 'Sunday Evenings with the Children,' make up a varied and popular The contributors include Dr. Hugh volume. Macmillan, Dr. James Macgregor, Mr. J. G. Wood, Mr. G. Holden Pike, Agnes Giberne, Mrs. Charles Garnett, the author of 'Episodes of an Obscure Life,' Mr. W. Procter, and many other of the most noted contributors to our serial literature. The illustrations are for the most part of a high order.
- From Messrs. Lea & Shepard, Boston.-'I ore and Aft: a story of actual sea life.' Mr. Robert B. Dixon, the author of this book, was fourteen months at sea, first of all 'before the mast,' and during the latter portion of the time as mate or officer. The book is a particularly well printed small octavo volume, with characteristic binding. The narrative is very interesting, and gives a good || idea of the hardships belonging to sea life, especially in small vessels; and it differs, perhaps advantageously, from former accounts, in that the language is not too 'nautical.' Thus the writer speaks of the hands crawling towards the 'centre of the yard,' which is more intelligible to the ordinary reader than if he had said the 'slings of the yard.' In the course of the book some ex-

illustrated by H.R.H. Princess Alice, Sir D. Macnee, W. J. Leitch, H. Furniss, Davidson Knowles, J. Henderson, Giacomelli, Montbard Macnab. Biscombe Gardner, and others. When we say that this marvellously cheap annual contains the complete text of Walt-r Besant's story 'All in a Garden Fair,' and of 'Pearla,' by M. Betham Edwards, with twelve effective illustrations, we have said enough to show that better 'money's worth' has never been offered to the reading public. The religious papers in the volume are of a high order, among the most poticeable being Canon Barry's papers on 'The Order of Revelation ' in St. Paul's Epistles;' and 'Fragments of Teaching in Eversley Church,' by Canon Kingsley. The biographical papers include Principal Shairp's Sketch of Dr. Pusey and the Oxford Movement; Canon Fremantle's tribute to Archbishop Tait, Mrs. Oliphant's appreciative notice of Anthony Trollope, Professor Lindsay on Martin Luther, and a set of three readable articles entitled 'Footprints in Rome,' by Mr. Haweis. Science is represented in a variety of pleasant and useful essays; Travel and Adventure has Mr. Richard Jefferies as one of its contributors; the Bocial and Philanthropic articles include graphic descriptions of the life of the poor in London and Paris, and a sympathetic paper by Miss Ellice amples of sailors' songs, such as men use when at work about the decks, are given, with musical notation. We do not remember to have seen this done before.

- From Messrs. S. W. Partridge & Co.—' Martin Luther the Reformer.' A biographical sketch of Luther, each chapter of which is headed by a text from the Bible, selected as specially appropriate to the various episodes of the Reformer's life. To those who want a brief outline of Luther's career this little volume will be found to give all they can desire, and its numerous illustrations will make it popular with children.
- From Messrs. Seeley, Jackson, & Halliday.-'The Pharaohs and their People : Scenes of Old Egyptian Life and History,' by E. Berkley. Egypt has of late occupied so large a place in the public regard in its connection with present troubles that there must be a numerous public for a work like this, which deals in a popular and yet scholarly fashion with the past of the historic nation. Mr. Berkley carries us through mythical periods and early records down to the time of the last independent dynasties and the Persian conquest, and in every chapter we have either coloured sketches of the ancient monuments or

well-executed engravings. The pleasantly large type of the volume makes it easy reading, and the fact that the manuscript was submitted to Professor Lushington, of Glasgow University, furnishes a sufficient guarantee of the accuracy of its numerous references to ancient documents and records. The descriptions of the tombs and other monuments of the ancient land, with the graphic illustrations which the publishers have so liberally provided, will give the book a chief place among works on Egypt and the Egyptians.

From the same.—' The City in the Sea: Stories of the Old Venetians from the Chronicles.' With sixteen illuminations. By the author of 'Belt and Spur.' A faithful rendering of some of the earliest chronicles of Venice, illustrated by some beautifully executed reproductions of the illuminations from ancient MSS. and by one of Canaletto's views of Venice; Uccello's 'Battlepiece' in our own National Gallery, and Gozzoli's 'Brides of Venice.' The subject of the book is so far removed from the beaten track, and there is so much of charm in the old writings to which the author introduces us, that we anticipate for the volume a very cordial reception, while its artistic 'get up' will win for it unqualified praise.

From Mr. Walter Smith. — 'The Established Church Question : How to Deal with it.' By the author of the 'Englishman's Brief on Behalf of his National Church.' It was scarcely to be expected that three notices of motion for the disestablishment of the National Church of England and Wales and of the Scottish Kirk would be allowed to pass unnoticed by the defenders of the threatened institutions, and here we have a compact and vigorous little book, from an author well qualified to take up the cudgels on behalf of Church and State. The writer's previous volume, 'The Englishman's Brief,' published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, has, we believe, met with a very large sale, and he here goes further into the question and undertakes to supply those who are disposed to meet the orators of the Liberation Society with arguments ready to hand. His advice as to the best method of dealing with an opponent is so sensible, and would be of such infinite value if it could be generally acted on in such debates, that we quote it from the introduction :----

by the Earl of Shaftesbury, K.G. Illustrated. Mr. Young's earlier work, 'Modern Missions,' won so wide a popularity that he has wisely resolved to follow it up by a second volume, travelling over the same field. In the present case he gives us a chronicle of the earlier rather than the latter history of the various missions, and we agree with Lord Shaftesbury, who says in the preface that 'to those who desire to read about these important things and think upon them, but who have little or no time for reading, Mr. Young's books will be of singular value.' His lordship adds, 'hardly a hole or corner which has been visited by a messenger of the Gospel passes without a record; and his pages are enriched by stirring narratives of the endurances and achievements of these devoted and admirable pioneersno research has been shunned; nearly every point has been touched; and the author writes with the fervour, and yet judgment, of a man who knows and feels the sublimity of his subject.' Apart from the records of the purely missionary work accomplished abroad, the book shows in detail the results of the labours of the chief societies, and will prove a valuable aid to all who have to speak or preach on their behalf. To the reader interested in Christian effort, we can commend the volume, and its numerous illustrations will make it useful in the school-room.

From the same.—' The Adventures of Robinson Crusoe,' by Daniel Defoe. Newly edited after the original editions, with twenty illustrations by Kauffman. A brief biographical sketch of Daniel Defoe, forms the editor's introduction to this new and handsome issue of the famous work, of which 'S. R. B.' truly says, 'it has become the chief of all boys' books and every Englishman loves it.' It is no excessive praise to say, as the writer does, that 'no fiction perused at a later day can reproduce the exquisite feeling of fanciful fear caused by reading of the footprint in the sand; or bring again such admiration as is felt for Man Friday; or give the delight inspired by Friday's encounter with the bear; happy memories of days when not only were we, but all the world was, young.' The pictures in the volume are printed in colours with good artistic effect, and with the bright crimson

When the lecturer sits down, get up instantly, and make no speech, but confine yourself simply and exclusively, as one of the audience, to the exercise of your right in asking questions, requiring the lecturer, or chairman, or other person concerned, to name the author or authors, volume, and page on which he founds his historical assertions, and to give the meeting his definite authorities for any assertions made as to abuses in the Church, or for any other doubtful statement by the making of which it is sought to bias the opinion and obtain the votes of those present against the Church.

The book covers the whole question of the union of the Church and State, and deals seriatim with the arguments commonly advanced by those who are seeking to break it up. The Church is, the author contends, more free than any sect, notwithstanding her supposed chains, and he disputes from point to point the justice of the charges on which the Liberationists base their Proceedings.

From Mr. T. Fisher Unwin.—'Light in Lands of Darkness': a record of Missionary Labour among Greenlanders, Eskimos, Patagonians, Syrians, Armenians, Nestorians, Persians, Egyptians, and Jews, by Robert Young. With introduction and gold cover it forms a most attractive edition of the old book.

From the office of 'Young England.'-' Yourg England,' Volume for 1883. A capital present for a boy, consisting of the numbers of the magazine for the year, bound in blue and gold. with a coloured frontispiece. The chief story running through the volume is 'I, Benjamin Holbeck, and how I fared at the Siege of Plymouth;' an interesting bit of historical fiction, ' done into Victorian English' by M. A. Paull. The papers on 'Missionary Adventures' are readable and full of information, and there are some excellent little articles on Astronomy. The magazine is fully illustrated, and its 'Pigeon Hole,' 'Prize Awards,' 'Pioneer Column,' and other special features, are well calculated to win favour with boy readers.

OUR WEDNESDAY BOOK-BOX. CHRISTMAS BOOKS.__I.

'IF Christmas is regarded, in an age of shattered illusions, as the season of boredom and dyspepsia, the publishers at least may repose in the happy consciousness that their " withers are unwrung." Nevertheless, as their efforts do not tend to diminish directly the drain on the paternal purse, they must be content to take their share of the general anathema launched at this season by every adult Briton against all providers of Christmas presents. But parsimony could not prevail against the temptation to seize on so cheap and efficacious a means of keeping up the traditions of Yuletide as is offered by the heap of elegant and attractive volumes before us. Beginning with those intended for the tiniest of readers, we have the exquisite gift-book, Up Stream¹ (Sampson² Low), which owes its undoubted charms, both of picture and verse, to Mr. R. André. History is symbolised by a gradually narrowing stream which two lads trace to its source, passing in review on their journey some of the great turningpoints in the life of the human race. In a mild and superficial way the book is also designed as a satire on the doctrine of evolution, in connection with which The verses are Mr. André displays a rare power of humorous illustration. simple, and, as a rule, neatly turned; but Mr. André tells his story with infinitely more finish and effect through the medium of his pencil. He has adorned his book with a series of drawings, which have been reproduced in the fnest style of chromo-lithography, so that none of their beauty or suggestiveness has been lost or even dimmed. In point of artistic merit, Mr. Spence's illustrations of Perseus, the Gorgon Slayer² (same publishers), conceived in the most rigid spirit of the æsthetic cult, are quite up to the same standard. This is a rhyming version of the adventures of Danaë's ill-starred son, dished up in an innocuous form by Mr. W. J. Gordon. The Boats of the World³ (same publishers) is a book in which all lads will delight, as their inborn craving for knowledge in matters nautical will be fully satisfied by the information it contains about the boats of every country, from the war canoe of the Fijians to the Thames wherry. All the craft are depicted in tinted engravings, and the letterpress is concise and clear.'
